Subscription conditions survive unscathed.

Those of you who have requested back issues will receive them as they are available gratis. In the future, back issues will be available only for the prior year as they are available.

The first Georgian Annual will be published eventually, and \$35 will put you on the mailing list (if you aren't already) up until we order the paper. After that, subscriptions will be entered for the issue following. If you have subscribed, you will get annuals equal to or greater than the number of times you sent in your 35 bucks. All two of you.

We no longer take ads but will be happy to make mention of you in the monthly as space is available.

The submission specifications have changed somewhat and are worth some careful consideration:

To submit articles for consideration in the Annual, please help us out by:

- 1. Sending a cover letter with your publishing name, other name (see below), and permission to print in the Annual (and monthly, if you so desire);
- the Annual (and monthly, if you so desire);
  2. A SASE sufficient to return your manuscript or check (see below);
- 3. The typed (double-spaced) manuscript.

If you manuscript is accepted for publication in the annual, you will be sent a check for \$20 on acceptance. (If you prefer equivalent compensation in silver, please let us know in your letter in lieu of your other name. Be sure to send a sufficient SASE.)

If your manuscript is rejected for the Annual and your cover letter indicates that it can be considered for the monthly, we will do so. Rejected manuscripts will be returned only if you have sent a SASE. All publication rights revert to the author on publication.

Tarostar, Stan, Our Lady of the Wild Things, Rik, and Merlin, please contact me for your payment preference. Moonraven, \$20 has been mailed to you, plus \$20 in silver. Please see Pagan Studies Contest below.

Please mark all other correspondence CLEARLY with either "for publication" or "NFP" (not for publication). This greatly simplifies my work. It also helps if you enclose a SASE.
