### HERBS

MERLE SEZ - We were all waiting for Georgia to arrive at our last Sabbat, feeling it was time to extract from her some of her herbal beauty secrets. When she came in, we told her there would be no food or wine until she told us. Georgia held out longer than expected (about 30 sec.) before she started talking faster than I could write it all down...so I'll pass on what I was able to record.

HAIR CONDITIONER - use an infusion of nettles or lime flowers as a final rinse.

TO CLEAR DANDRUFF- use an infusion of parsley rubbed into the scalp every few days.

TO DARKEN HAIR - pour boiling water over two or three sprigs of rosemary. Let it cool, and warm it up again just before use as a final rinse. An infusion of chamomile will brighten fair hair.

Yogurt with an infusion of fennel seeds and some chopped fennel leaves is good as a wrinkle smoother for the face.

A facial pack of egg white and lemon with some finely chopped yarrow helps to clear spots, and is good for greasy skin.

Mix together with gum turpentine to form a crumbly mixture. Prepare this on a Thursday in the hour of the sun...when the moon is waxing toward full.

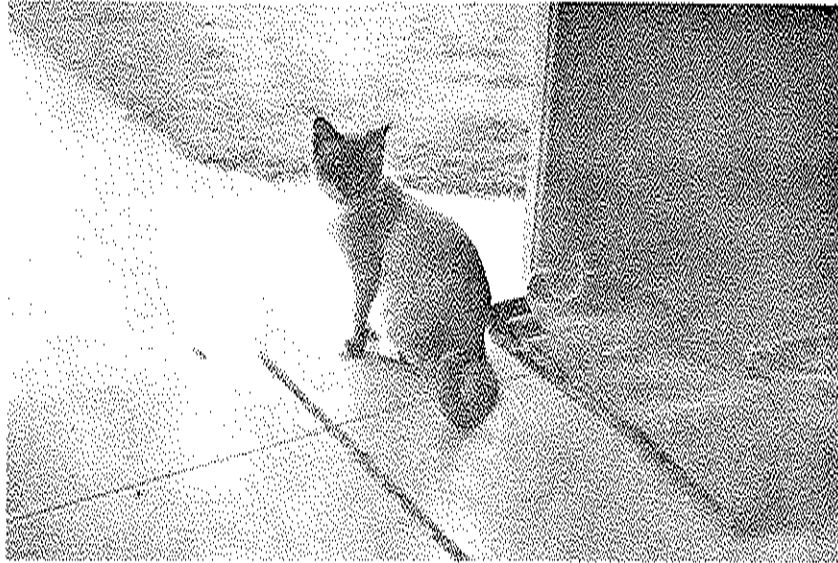
