Here is a "HOW TO": HONEY WINE

The traditional wine of the Craft for hundreds of years. Also known as Witches' Brew.

3 Quarts of water (distilled) 1 quart honey

Add honey and water together, bring to a boil, and boil for five minutes to kill the enzymes in the honey. Cool to 110 degrees. Add one cake of yeast or two packages of dry yeast.

Pour in to a sterilized gallon jug. Put a plastic bag over the neck, and secure with a rubber band. Place it in a dark place for 7 or 8 days, or until it stops working. Put in the refrigerator until it clears. Pour into wine bottles and cork. It is ready to drink...about 20 proof.

Note: a good flavoring...½ juice of lemon or other herb of your choice.

If the wine doesn't help set the mood, here is an oil to help seduce a special friend or sweetheart. This, I can say, works...how, I can't say...but enjoy: Seduction Oil.

- ½ cc Vast Oil or blackcat oil or #20 oil.
- ½ cc Bergamont oil.
- ½ cc control oil
- 1 cc dark musk oil

THE TEMPLE OF DENDUR by Paul

In the 1950's the go ahead was given to build the Aswan Dam, the modern day Egyptians knowing full well that its construction would undoubtedly mean the flooding of the Nubia, resulting in the loss of many ancient monuments and much ancestral heritage. UNESCO began an all out campaign to raise funds from all over the world to try to save as many Nubian monuments as possible.

The United States was largely responsible for saving much of the great statuary of Abu Simbel, and in appreciation of this, the Egyptian government offered the little Temple of Dendur to America. The temple had been taken apart in 1963 by the Egyptians, but did not reach New York until August 21, 1968. It was packed in 640 crates and weighed over 800 tons. It was housed in a vinyl air structure until the climate controlled environment could be erected at the Metropolitan Museum of Art. When finished, this wing would approximate the light and surroundings of the original location, complete with a reflecting pool to the east to simulate the impression of the Nile.

After visiting the Temple on a recent trip to N.Y., I can honestly say that the designer's efforts were not in vain. It was every bit as magnificent as I had expected it to be. The bas-reliefs are simply fantastic, and even the Pagan who knows little of the Egyptian Pantheon will find some familiar Gods & Goddesses. The inner sanctuary was supposed to house the spirits of the Goddess Isis and the God Osirus when it was built back in the first century B.C. Now it is in our own country where now Pagans can appreciate it, too.

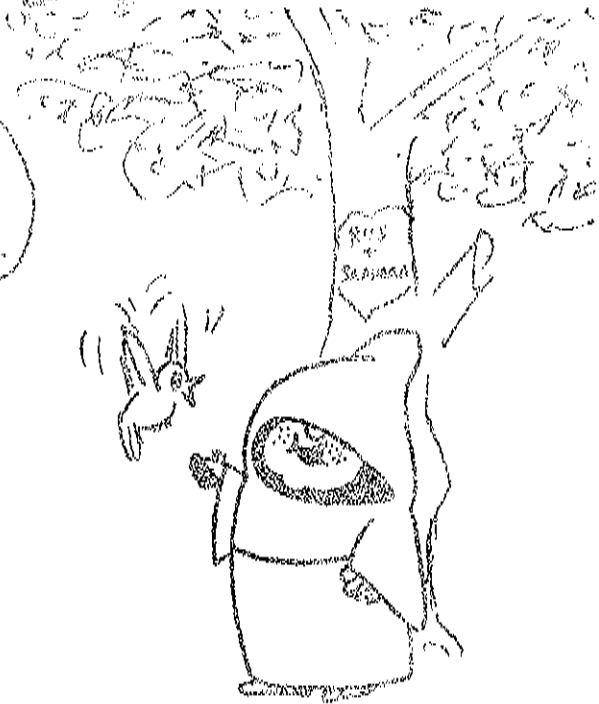

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BEAUTY

And let's not forget the one about "skin-deep"...etc., etc.

Much has been written and said about "Beauty", but even Webster has failed to give an adequate definition of the word. In his dictionary he says that Beauty is, quote: qualities which please the senses or exalt the mind.

One day, after overhauling the engine on his motorcycle, a neighbor exclaimed: "Listen to that purr--doesn't she sound Beautiful?"

I suppose the noise was quite pleasing to his senses, however, I doubt if it would inspire a poet.

A friend who was in electronics was deeply involved in drawing a schematic for some new remote control gadget. The mathematics surely exalted his mind to the total exclusion of the physical world, while he was thusly engaged --however, the finished blueprint was hardly worthy of the Louvre.

So, Mr. Webster, your definition doesn't work very well!

Beauty is indeed a potent "power" in the world, for it seems that everyone covets that which is most beautiful, without even knowing exactly what it is.

What meets the eye is often an illusion of mis-judgment, based upon a false set of standards, usually dictated by commercial enterprise. In order to truly perceive beauty, one must "feel" it rather than simply seeing it...its radiations will penetrate one's aura, causing a specific response in the astral body of the beholder, which in turn reciprocates by "re-charging" the aura of the thing or person beheld.

This would most certainly indicate that Beauty is, then, one of Nature's Forces, A form of radiant energy which is gathered (or stored) into, or by an individual or object. Thereafter, it radiates its energy outward from that in which it is stored.

When such an individual seems to have all the necessary attributes, yet lacks the spark which ignites true radiance, you can work miracles by placing your right hand upon their left cheek, and simply saying, "You are beautiful!" But you must mean it in all sincerity--not be thinking the opposite while saying it. Such a small effort can do so very much to prolong and enhance a life, which may have a great deal to offer others in return.

HELPFUL HINTS FOR BEGINNERS

Perhaps I didn't help recently when I spoke of the element symbols on the altar. Sorry, didn't mean to confuse anyone. Incense goes to the east of the altar as an air symbol. A red candle or something of the sort goes to the south as a fire element symbol. Water goes to the west as a water symbol (wine also would go to the west), a pentacle of silver or perhaps copper with inscribed symbols would go to the north as the earth element symbol. For those lacking a pentacle, a cup of earth or salt might be used. The cakes may also be placed at the north. The Georgians use the wand at the east as an air tool, the sword at the south (point to the east) as a fire tool. You will find that some groups may reverse the wand and sword since they consider the sword as air and the wand as fire. Remember, these comments always apply to the Georgians and not necessarily to all groups.

At 10:12 a.m. Monday, January 7, 1980, it was only an idea..word spread until a network was established by 9:05 p.m. This network consisted of Witches, Pagans, and concerned non-Pagans who had love and energy to send to a brother and sister in need of it. And Loy and Louise Stone will need the loving support of all of us even more as the trial continues.

As our circle began working at 9:05, we were aware of other circles working in coordination with our Central Time, in North Carolina, Minnesota, Kansas, 4 in Dallas, Mesquite, FT. Worth, Waco, Calvert, Houston, in New Mexico, Arizona, Los Angeles, and Bakersfield, Ca. In addition, there were non-Witches in Ohio and Colorado who had their own form of circle working to the same purpose.

At 9:30 p.m., whether direct or relayed through other groups, those built-up pools of energy interlaced with a purpose of strength and serenity were released to Loy and Louise.

This is a work we will continue each night as long as the trial continues. Also, some of us are sending a postcard daily, from all these various places...not only to daily let Loy and Louise know that they are not alone, but also to let the Post Office (and therefore the community) realize that they are not alone. There is no need for any return on the postcards, nor full names, unless you should choose to do so. Loy and Louise will know most of the handwritings, or postmarks, and there is no need to change a low-profile stance in the process. Merely a date..and a brief loving message will do.

RITUAL ETIQUETTE by LADY FAUNA (Calif.)

note to editor: this is a labour of love offered at publication at tremendous personal risk....

FINALLY, you have been invited to a ritual. You accept. What now?

Arrange for transportation to the place of meeting. Your host or hostess may be able to assist you if you cannot arrange to get there alone. It is best to rely on yourself for transportation as much as possible, as your host or hostess may have additional responsibilities for the occasion of which you have no knowledge.

Find out what time you should be there and BE THERE ON TIME. If you arrive early, you may interrupt preparations for the ritual or disturb your host or hostess while they catch a last minute nap before the evening's excitement. If you arrive late, you may interrupt the ritual and may be disappointed by being turned away at the door. If you can't make it on time, don't go. The NEXT DAY write or call your host or hostess, explain you arrived late and did not wish to interrupt the festivities, and thank them for the invitation. It will practically insure you another invitation on a different occasion.

Know what you are expected to wear in advance, as well as what you should bring for the feast and ritual. If you are not told to bring something specific, it is considered good taste to bring cheese, wine, or munchies of some kind unless you are told not to bring food or beverages. If you have unusual dietary needs, provide for them yourself rather than going hungry or expecting someone else to provide for you. (At one time, I was not eating meat. Rather than expecting my hostess to prepare meatless dishes, I fixed my own. This assured me I would not go hungry, while providing enough for everyone to share a new culinary experience. More and more meatless dishes appeared once everyone found out how cheap, hearty and tasty these dishes were!)

This will be a new, unfamiliar experience for you and your host or hostess should be prepared for that. If you run up on a preparation for the ritual itself with which you are not familiar, ask your host or hostess about it. They will give you as much information as they can without violating their oath of secrecy. If you feel uncomfortable about participating in the Circle, ask your host or hostess in advance if it is permissible to observe only. If it is not, either excuse yourself and leave or prepare to confront your misgivings with your host or hostess and participate.

Once inside the Circle, follow the actions and guidance of your host and hostess. If you make a mistake, don't be overly concerned about it. It will not be the first mistake made in a Circle and the less fuss made over a mistake, the less it will interrupt the flow of the Circle. Good intentions and thoughts are much more important than physical expressions anyway. If you have questions, try to save them until after the ritual is completed. Your host or hostess will anticipate that you will have questions and will try to answer them as best as possible.

The Lord and Lady are the guests of honor. Etiquette states that the guests of honor are the last to arrive and the first to leave, and their leaving indicates the festivities are drawing to a close. Once the Circle is broken and people begin to leave, prepare to leave yourself unless you are a house guest

of the host or hostess and have made advance arrangements to stay overnight. If you are in doubt about whether it's time for you to go, ask your host or hostess.

You may want to bring a friend, spouse, child or pet to the ritual. If that is your desire, discuss this IN ADVANCE with your host or hostess. CROSSING THE THRESHOLD TO THE CIRCLE IS NOT "IN ADVANCE". It is best to know if other guests will be welcome before your friend, and possibly you, are turned away at the door. Many groups do not wish to have guests that have not been screened in advance. If your friend is welcome, remember you are responsible for them and prepare them for the occasion as much as possible. Introduce your friend to people who can help with questions you cannot answer. Remember, this does not relieve you of your responsibility for your guest. If you bring someone with you as your guests to a ritual, prepare to assume responsibility for them for the duration of the occasion, especially in the case of children. Your friend, host, and hostess will appreciate you for it.

If you act in a responsible, considerate and honest manner, it shows you are capable of exercising those qualities which are necessary in the close working relationship mandated by the Witches' Circle. It is a large step in the direction of the knowledge you seek, regardless of the outcome of your relationship with those whom you have chosen to celebrate the forces of Nature and Life.

MORE ON MAKING CRAFT CONTACTS by LADY FAUNA in Calif.

What a nice article from Lady Soanara on making craft contacts! So, now you've made your first contact. What happens next?

Expect an exchange of information. Your first exchanges may be by mail or through a social introduction by a mutual friend. Your new contact will want some information from you-- a name by which you wish to be known so they can address you personally, your age (most groups will not take minors as students without expressed parental consent), your religious background, reading you have completed related to the Craft, specific interests you have related to the Craft (healing, Tarot, scrying, runes, etc.), and, most importantly, what are you seeking from them (Are you looking for a pen pal, a teaching situation, just exploring a different religion, doing research for a school project, writing a book, etc.) If you do not understand why a contact asks you a question, be honest and ask why.

Your contact will evaluate this information and decide if they can help you on your Path or whether it would be best to refer you elsewhere. The information you give them will help them decide if you have compatible interests and also open a line of communication should you have mutual interests.

If you have not had a personal interview, this might be your next step, distance permitting. You may be limited to a pen pal relationship for quite some time if you are not within reasonable commuting distance of your contact or if either of you have a transportation problem. However, it is best to arrange an in-person contact as soon as possible. Try to meet your new contact in a public place or in neutral territory. (Remember you are still strangers to each other and the new contact may be a wicardo masquerading as a Craft contact. This is a nasty reality we all wish wasn't there, but nonetheless, must be taken into consideration for your protection.

When selecting your place of meeting, arrange to have some privacy. If you are meeting at the home of a mutual friend, make arrangements with your friend in advance to have some privacy with your new contact. If you are meeting in a public place, select somewhere you can talk at length with minimal interruption and distraction. Your contact may have some suggestions.

After you have met your contact, ask the questions you most certainly still have. Your contact may not answer all of your questions but should explain why they do not wish to do so. Remember that "Perfect Love, Perfect Trust" is developed and is not necessarily extended beyond the Circle immediately. Crafters may not wish to reveal intimate details of their life. Think about the questions you ask. Consider the importance of the answers you seek. If the answer makes no difference to your continued relationship, don't ask the question.

When you feel you have enough information, evaluate the contact. You must decide what things you might be willing to make concessions on, as rarely, if ever, will you find someone who thinks the same way about everything as you do. Discuss misgivings and differences honestly with your contact as soon as they pop up, for to do otherwise is a disservice to both of you. Your new friend will love you all the more for your candor whether you part ways as friends or begin a relationship that will span many lifetimes.

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HELPFUL HINT FOR BEGINNERS from Manon in Modesto

After referring to the white-hilted knife as a boline for some time now, I realize that the white-hilted knife and the boline are two different tools. The white-hilted knife can have either one or two sharpened sides and is used only inside the magic Circle. It is used for carving, and whittling other tools of the Art. The boline on the other hand, which also has a white hilt, is used outside the magic Circle for cutting herbs, wands, etc. It usually has a curved sickle blade with only one honed side.

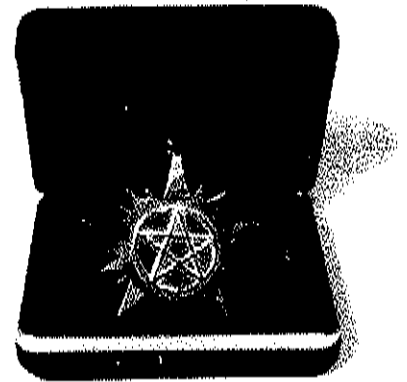

ABOVE: Elizabeth Pepper and Sibylla. Which one edits the Witches' Almanac?

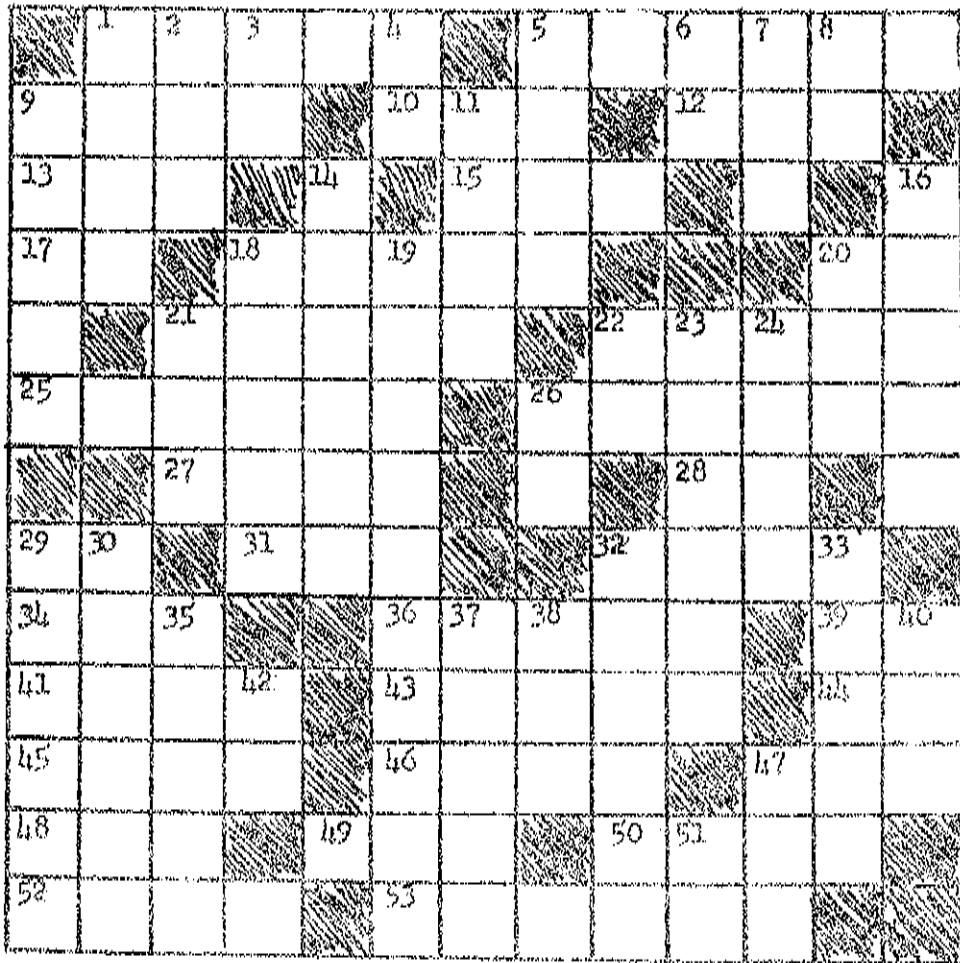


ABOVE: The Georgian Award designed by Arcane Crafts.

TAKING TRIPS

Even if you don't anticipate many trips with Puss, it's wise to accustom him to travelling and be prepared with a good cat carrier.

Your carrier should be large enough to contain an adult cat comfortably. It should be ventilated at one or both ends, and have a strong latch.

MAGICK AND TRANSFORMATION IN WORDS

by Gordon in the navy (still in Spain, I think)

To speak of the runes (properly) is to refer to the magickal script invented and used by the various and sundry Germanic tribes that inhabited continental Europe and England. The word "RUNE" derives from a west Germanic root which means "a secret; something whispered". (In modern Finnish, it refers to any poem, specifically to a magico-religious poem.)

The Futhark dates to the first century or so of the current era. Many of the letters and their associated meanings were derived from magickal symbols that the pre-literate Germanic tribes carved into rock faces (Hallristningar) at least as early as 1300 BCE. These rock carvings seem to be connected with Indo-European solar and fertility cults. These symbols were later combined with a European alphabet, probably either Thracian Greek or Northern Italic by an unknown tribe possibly as early as 800 BC. Limited evidence suggests that this tribe dwelt on the coast of the Black Sea.

The runes in their original form consist of 24 letters, often divided into 3 sets with 8 runes per set. One set for Frey, one set for Týr (Tyr) and one set known as Hagals set, probably referring to the forces of nature. Each rune had a name, each name possesses a magickal meaning, and each name had a stave of a poem that described the name. The runes were never a secular script. They were used almost exclusively for divination and hexing throughout most of their active history. Neither were they written as such; they were carved or engraved into wood or stone. The engraved characters were then filled with paint or dye, and on occasions, even blood.

Many of the inscriptions are impossible to read, and it was common practice to use complicated cipher systems, abbreviations, etc. when engraving an item.

The runes were brought to England no later than the fifth century. Their common use in England did not last past the tenth century, as the clergy took a very dim view of magickal alphabets. They fared a bit better in Scandinavia, since the last reference to their usage there was in the seventeenth century.

A bit of mythological background on the runes is appropriate at this time. Norse mythology attributes the invention of the runes to the Norns: Úrd, Verdandi, and Skuld. Odin acquired the runes by performing the "usual shamanistic sacrifice of dying in order to be reborn with power" of some sort. According to stanza 138 of the Havamal, Odin sacrificed himself on the world-ash Yggdrassil (Odin's steed) and hung there for nine days and nights. He neither ate nor drank for this time, and perceived the runes at his feet. He gathered them, fell from the tree, and his uncle Mimir nursed him back to health. Mimir then taught Odin 18 songs of power to use with the runes.

Karen in Colorado is enjoying a vacation between jobs. "Got NINE APPLEES a couple of weeks ago..I really like it. One of my rituals is in it. I don't recall seeing mention of The Spiral Dance by Starhawk. It is an excellent book, well written with some very good rituals and exercises. I'm really sorry Scott had that mandrake experience.' He could have killed himself. Please remind the readers that although as Witches the use of herbs is part of our heritage...it is with knowledge and intelligence that they should be used! Even if an herb is considered to be non-toxic, a person may still be allergic. I urge everyone to study and experiment with herbs carefully."

SNAPDRAGON is played by placing raisins on a dish and covering the raisins with alcohol (we used 151 rum) and setting it on fire. Then the players must snap (with fingers) the flaming raisins out of the dish and into a cup putting them out as they go. They must only take one at a time--player with the most raisins in their cup at the end of the game is the winner (our prize was a chocolate Ushabti). This can also be played if you're not playing for a prize, by snapping the still burning raisins directly into your mouth. Great game, but have people roll up sleeves and keep in mind this game can be dangerous if not prepared--have lots of Aloe Vera on hand. Also, if you have a lot of people you can time each person, we gave 45 seconds each.

SLICING FLOUR-- Take a large bowl and fill it with flour packing it down until it's like a round mound, turn it over and place on a plate. On top of the flour mound place a small gold ring. Every player gets a butter knife and the game begins. Each player must cut a slice from the mound without moving the ring. The first person to make the ring fall down into the flour has to pick it up with their teeth...when we played it, the person who lost had to go down several times before she found the ring, a totally hilarious game, but remember to put newspapers under the plate or you'll have flour everywhere!

Pagans might be interested to know, we have a small jewelry and gift item business here in San Diego, carrying mythological or unusual unique pieces from all over the world. Some of our items are on consignment in Ye Olde Enchantment Shop (Judith & Mel's) or Pagans can contact us by picking up our business card at the shop.

Take an empty crock pot and invert a bowl or cup on the bottom, place an empty cup or bowl on top of that right side up. Fill crock pot with orange flowers until about the halfway point, being careful not to get any orange blossoms in the cup that's sitting right side up. Then fill crock pot with water until it is just below flower level or even with it. I use distilled water in mine so that my completed product is actually double-distilled. Then invert the crock pot lid and fill with ice. Turn on the crock pot and let it cook (I usually use the high temperature). You can even run tubing from the crock pot lid to your sink so that you don't have to drain the water manually, so all you have to worry about is keeping ice on top of it and making sure your cup that's right side up (this would be called the reclamation cup) is not overflowing with beautiful double distilled homemade, fresh orange water!

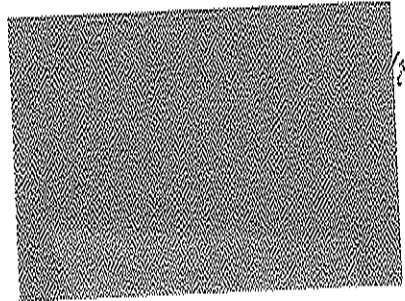
